CANDIDATES FOR CITY RACES ON THE BALLOT FOR APRIL 7, 2020

- Mayor Bob McManus seeks a 2nd term and will not face an opponent.
- District 3 Alderperson Chris Jockheck will not seek re-election and Quentin Rosandich will be the only candidate for that district on the ballot.
- District 5 Alderperson Steve Mac Swain will not seek re-election and Ed Wagner will be the only candidate for that district on the ballot.
- District 1, Michael Feirer, District 7, Adam Fischer and District 9, Tom Buttke all will seek two year terms, but will not face an opponent in the elections process.

IT'S TIME TO RENEW YOUR CAT AND DOG LICENSES

Dog and cat licenses run from January 1 through December 31. By City law all pets must be licensed by March 31, 2020.

If licensed after that date, a \$5 late fee is charged. The license must be renewed every year, otherwise the fine for failure to license a cat or dog is \$124.

Pets must be vaccinated for rabies by a licensed veterinarian. The veterinarian will then issue you a rabies certificate explaining the vaccination and the expiration date. Rabies vaccinations are good for one or three years. At the time of vaccination you will also be given a rabies tag. This rabies tag is not a license.

Ordinance states all cats and dogs living within the city limits of Marshfield and are five months of age or older must be licensed on an annual basis. The license requirement is for your safety to ensure that the animals have had their proper shots. The license is also used for the safe return of your pets if they are lost.



A "rabies certificate" must be obtained from the veterinarian before going to City Hall, located at 207 W. 6th Street, Marshfield. City Hall is open Monday through Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

The cost is as follows:

Dog: Neutered/spayed \$8
Dog: Unneutered/unspayed \$16
Cat: Neutered/spayed \$6
Cat: Unneutered/unspayed \$12

If for some reason the owners of a pet needing a license cannot make it to City Hall during business hours, a friend or family member can license the pet / Remember, however, to have them obtain the license in the owners name.

Marshfield also has a City Ordinance 9.52(3)(d)1 which states that a household may not have more than two dogs, cats, rabbits, guinea pigs, without a special written permit provided by an ordinance officer, following an inspection of the premises has been conducted and no nuisance will be created.
