HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMITTEE MINUTES
OF MARCH 7, 2016 MEETING

Meeting called to order by Chairperson Wood at 4:00 P.M. in Conference Room 108 of City Hall Plaza.

Approval of the Minutes of January 4, 2016 Meeting.

Citizen Comments.

Discussion of Main Street Historic Plaque Program.

Angie Eloranta, shared what the City of Omro, Wisconsin is doing for their plaque program. They used lightweight aluminum signs. The sign includes description and pictures. She will send them out to the Committee members so they can see what they look like. Joe Lawniczak thought it would be a good design for Marshfield Brick. Omro purchased 100 signs for \$6,800 and most of them lasted 20 years. She will continue to talk to Brian Hopperdietzel at Marshfield Monument to see if we can work with him.

Bargender suggested working with Burt Awards or Events Etc., to see if they do any engraving. Angie said it would be something we would have to budget for next year. Matt McLean said he could possibly allocate some money towards it. Cummings suggested spreading out the cost over a number of years.

Review of the 2016 Cultural Fair from Attendees.

Wood said that the Cultural Fair had a good turnout and there were a lot of people that didn't know the walking tour brochures were available. It was good to be next to North Wood County Historical Society. A lot of people didn't know where they could pick up the brochures. There were probably a couple of hundred people that stopped by.

Renew Membership to the Wisconsin Association of Historic Preservation Commissions for \$40.

HP16-07 Motion by Cummings second by Keogh to renew membership to the Wisconsin Association of Historic Preservation Commission for \$40.

Update on Brochure Displays in the Wildwood Park and Zoo.

Miller explained that he met with Justin Casperson, Parks and Recreation Department Director, to measure how much space is available for brochures in the bathroom hallway of the Wildwood Pavilion. He was very open to having brochures in this location. Miller also talked to Matt McLean, Director of the Convention and Visitors Bureau, and he was interested in working together on a brochure for that location to share on the cost. They have displays for other locations and he will be sending the information on those displays to Miller in the near future.

Wood asked for Matt's email address and he will send a photo of a display from the airport. He said Tom Buttke was also in favor of having it in the Zoo Store.

Update on Historic Preservation Month Activities.

Wood said that he's doing the bus tours again this year for those in senior housing. They will be doing a video tour with the other groups that don't have a bus. Miller explained that the latest available minutes were included in the packet. He invited those that have attended the meetings to share the projects that are being considered for Historic Preservation Month.

Bargender said they haven't come up with a theme yet. Similar activities to previous years will continue to go on. They are looking at having the kickoff event at the Round Barn. He believes they may be having a meeting tomorrow to discuss the Historic Preservation Month activities.

Consideration to Sponsor School District Art Display Awards for up to \$500.

Miller said that the budget for this year was \$500. Last year the Committee spent \$318 on the ten awards. The ribbons cost \$68 and the MACCI gift certificates were \$250.

The awards are tentatively scheduled for May 12th. They are trying to avoid conflicts with the sports calendar.

Bargender said the second semester projects are focused on the Round Barn.

Discussion of Possible Stewardship Award Nominations.

Bargender asked this item to be placed on the agenda. In the past they've kicked around the idea of nominating the School District for their work on the Middle School. Cummings asked who do you give the award to? Bargender suggested talking to Ron Sturomski.

Wood also mentioned Lorraine Markee as a possible future nominee for the award.

Update on Main Street Historic Plaque Program.

Main Street Marshfield is still waiting on information about being able to put together similar plaques as the Omro program with Marshfield Monument. The biggest challenge so far is finding a way to do the black bordering that the Omro plaques have. Staff will be reaching out to Events Etc. and has talked to Burt Trophy and Awards to see if they are able to make outdoor plaques. Staff spoke to Jill from Burt Trophy and Awards and she is looking into options for the plaques. It is unlikely that any of that information will be available by Monday, but any updates received will be presented at the meeting.

Update on Brochure Displays in the Wildwood Park and Zoo.

The space that we have to work with for the brochure display in the Wildwood Pavilion is 3.85 feet between the light switch and the drinking fountain. Staff has found a variety of display options in an office furniture catalog and has included those pages in this packet for the Committee's review. The dimensions of the different displays are included in the brochure, but the pocket dimensions are not shown. Most of the smaller pockets won't fit the Historic Walking Tour brochures, but you can typically put two sets of brochures in the larger magazine style pockets and just overlap them a bit. The second to last picture is a display rack that Matt McLean sent over as another option. The dimensions for that rack are 8 3/4 " wide 12" deep and 42" tall. Staff would like the Committee to review the options and come up with a recommendation at the meeting on the style of rack they would like to see in the Wildwood Pavilion.

Staff is recommending Item C. Acrylic Oak Literature Racks on page 854. The 9 pocket style rack is in the lobby of the 6th floor in City Hall and each pocket can hold approximately 50 Historic Walking Tour brochures (25 brochures of two separate districts – photo is included). Staff would recommend going with the 6 pocket rack to reduce cost and while providing enough space between the rack and drinking fountain. Although staff has a recommendation, we wanted to include other options so the Committee could see what else is out there and consider other display racks.

Matt McLean said that MACCI has been considering replacing their racks in the MACCI

office and he would look into the possibility of donating one of the racks to the Committee. Unfortunately, none of the racks would fit the space in the pavilion. However, if the Zoo Store would allow a rack and it would fit in the store, that might be an option. Once we get the rack for the pavilion taken care of, we'll look at one for the Zoo Store.

Update on Historic Preservation Month Activities and the Installation of Yard Signs.

The minutes for the latest meeting of the Historic Preservation Month Planning Committee were not available at the time packets were sent out. If they arrive before the meeting, copies will be made and distributed to the Committee on Monday. Anyone that attended any of the 2016 meetings is welcome to share their comments on the planned activities for Historic Preservation Month. Feel free to think of opportunities for the Historic Preservation Committee to be involved in the upcoming activities.

Additionally, volunteers will be needed to put up yard signs in the historic districts. The two tentative dates to put up the yard signs are Friday, April 29, 2016 or Monday, May 2, 2016. Please review your calendars prior to the meeting to see if you are able to help. Staff will have the signs ready for the date volunteers are available.

Discussion and Consideration of Possible Stewardship Award Nominations – North Wood County Historical Society, Upham Mansion, 212 West 3rd Street.

Last month the Committee made some suggestions of possible Stewardship Award nominees. Donald Schnitzler has submitted a nomination for the North Wood County Historical Society for their work on the Upham Mansion. The nomination is included in the packet.

Continue Discussion on Buildings of Architectural Interest Brochure Materials.

The Committee decided to move forward with the architecturally significant residential structures brochure. The brochure will be community wide. Vickie Schnitzler will provide an update at the meeting.

Update on the 2016 Budget.

Last month, staff reported that the Historic Preservation Committee's 2016 Budget had \$500 for the student art awards and the Committee recommended spending up to \$500 for this year's awards. When reviewing the budget for the April update, staff realized that the 2016 Budget was only \$350, not \$500. The \$350 budgeted was still more than what was spent in 2015, but less than the approved amount by the Committee last month. Staff will work to keep the award and ribbon cost at or below the \$350 budget number.

The itemized budget below includes \$50 for the Spring Conference registration. The Committee will be asked to decide if they want to cover that expense in the next agenda item.

Discussion of Covering the Spring Historic Preservation Conference Registration Fee in Green Bay for \$50.

The 2016 Spring Conference will be held on Friday, April 22 through Saturday, April 23 in Green Bay, Wisconsin. The cost is \$50. This year's cost for a one year subscription is \$99.95, a \$10 increase over last year. There have been a number of QR Codes placed downtown and the Committee has expressed an interest in getting more QR Codes out there to the public.

Renew Membership to the National Trust for Historic Preservation for \$20.

The 2016 membership renewal for the National Trust for Historic Preservation is due again. The National Trust is an organization that works to preserve places that are historically significant as well as provide education and outreach programs regarding historic preservation. Included is a year's subscription to Preservation Magazine. The amount that the Committee gave last year was \$20.
