Breanna Speth received an email from Senator Herb Kohl thanking her for contacting him. He has been honored to have been able to take part in deep discussion and lively debate with so many people.

DISCUSS BRIAN SAUER'S CABLE TV COMMITTEE APPOINTMENT

Chairperson Holck sent Brian Sauer a letter in regards to his absence from the Cable TV Committee meetings. Brian has not responded to his letter yet.

FACILITY LEASE DISCUSSION

Finance Director Strey addressed questions in regards to the lease payments from the Cable TV Committee members

Kummer spoke with Fred Schindler of Marawood and he won't be able to attend the Cable TV Committee meetings until January of next year. There is a clause in the contract about renegotiating 9 months ahead of time, but Fred Schindler is willing to waive that.

The Cable TV Committee will negotiate the lease and then it will be reviewed by the City Administrator and City Attorney when the time comes.

STATEGIC PLANNING SESSION DISCUSSION

Things to discuss in the Strategic Planning Sessions:

- 1. Define what Public Access is.
- 2. How do we staff the facility?
- 3. What things do we provide for the community, the City and the educational institutions and how do we implement that?
- 4. Restate what the Public Access mission and the purpose is.
- 5. What kind of equipment we are going to need.
- 6. How much equipment we are going to supply and what equipment we are going to supply.

Chairperson Holck said we need to know where we are going, how we are going to get there and what it takes to get there.

Markwardt said that he has recently helped a nonprofit group with strategic planning and it can be a painful long process. There are still day to day operations that need to be done and we have to be sure that we aren't putting everything on hold until we get the strategic plan done. How do we blend the long range plan that we are developing with the reality of what we need to do right now?

Daniels said that technology is rapidly changing and we need to know where cable is going to be in 5 years.

City Administrator Barg suggested starting the strategic planning discussion at a full committee level for two or more sessions to get some stuff on the table and then break out into subcommittees and then bring the subcommittee's findings back to the full committee.

Markwardt wondered if there was a consultant or anyone in City government who is already an expert in the process that would qualify to help us with a strategic planning session.

Finance Director Strey said that we could contract someone on a stipend basis to help keep us on track. The UW and Mid-State have programs that do this.

City Administrator Barg said you want someone leading and facilitating who doesn't have a vested interest.

The consensus of the committee was to start brainstorming with the entire committee.

Finance Director Strey and City Administrator Barg offered to help with finding a consultant at a reasonable cost.

Finance Director Strey recommended holding strategic planning meetings separate from the regular Cable TV Committee meetings.

Finance Director Strey left meeting at 5:38 p.m.

City Administrator Barg left meeting at 5:41 p.m.

I have spoken with Fred Schindler of Marawood Construction. Due to scheduling conflicts he is not able to meet with the committee in October or November. December would be difficult for all of us. Level I Basic Camera Training is Scheduled for Wednesday November 21at 6:30pm. We will be highlighting basic operation of the Panasonic AC130 Digital card based camera.

Internet viewing of select programs on MCTV PEG Central is dramatically up. Council Preview and Public Library programs account for the greatest increase. These shows are marketed through the use of secondary web sites and the use of e-mail distribution lists.

MCTV Hosted the MACCI BGA Candidate Forum (69 & 86th Assembly Districts. We also taped 4 individual Candidate Profiles Which don Nystrom Hosted. Deb Hall Marshfield City Clerk did a program to inform residents on current election laws and procedures.

The piece we did on the Frac Sand issue in Wisconsin Rapids seems to have aroused great interest. Chairman Holk and I went to a recent Hwy Commission meeting at WI Rapids on the issue. We taped the proceedings as well as obtaining interviews with Wood County Supervisor Ed Wagner and an affected business.

In November we will be making plans for our Annual December Christmas gathering and Open House. Our invitation list will include volunteers, city offficials, nonprofit groups and the general public. Thank you to committee members George Holk and Dean Markwardt for the time they have given to MCTV running cameras this month. Other volunteers have also given of their time during this busy season. Their help during this election year is greatly appreciated We are looking forward to looking at our long term staffing needs during our strategic planning sessions in the beginning of 2013.
