Discussion on dumping snow in the city, specifically dumping snow by the city cemetery.

Street Superintendent Panzer explained where the snow dumping locations are in the city and why they use those certain spots. All of the locations are chosen for financial and productivity reasons. It is very costly for the city to haul snow and for productivity, the closer they are from the area they are removing snow to where they dump it they are able to move more snow and be more productive. He met with several members of the condo association of Sawyer Drive and they are concerned about the drainage from the melting snow, the noise and the remnants of garbage left behind after the snow melts.

Roger Kilty of 1609 Sawyer Drive explained the issues that they are having at their location from the snow melting and going into their basement and elevator shaft. Noise starts at 1:00 a.m. and goes until they are done plowing. What concerns him is that it has been 6 months and nothing has been done. If they dump there again next year they are going to have the same problems. It isn't just the runoff; it is water saturation that is coming up underneath the building.

Director of Public Works Knoeck talked about some solutions for this site. They are going to try a combination of drainage tiles and ditching to intercept the groundwater before it crosses the property line and collect it and bring it into the drainage way instead of allowing the groundwater to continue towards the buildings. They have looked at shifting the snow pile so it is not as close to their property, possibly moving it farther north. But the current location is the preferred site so they are going to try the drain tiles and ditching before they look for an alternative site.

Aldersperson Wagner asked Dan Knoeck to stay in contact with the condo association to keep them updated on what is being done.

The city will do some survey work to confirm some grades and to see how drainage is operating out there and then develop a plan for ditching. Street crew will then ditch and lay tile probably sometime in September.
